## **Recapping CV19 progression**

- Hydroxychloroquine (Plaquenil) continues to show promise as more results are reported. The reports that I have reviewed show it is more effective in the early stages and when taken with <u>Azithromycin</u>. "Pre-clinical studies in animals as well as the first data from clinical studies show that hydroxychloroquine kills the coronavirus" Novartis CEO. There is still a lot of controversy in the medical community and media on the efficacy of this as a treatment due to the small, non-double-blind studies. The treatment has been used for 60 year for Malaria and is FDA approved to be used off-label by physicians for CV19.
- A study by Stanford researchers (yet to be peer reviewed) showed a very high discrepancy in the percent of the population infected with the CV19 virus. "Our data imply that, by April 1 (three days prior to the end of our survey) between 48,000 and 81,000 people had been infected in Santa Clara County. The reported number of confirmed positive cases in the county on April 1 was 956, 50-85-fold lower than the number of infectious predicted by this study." The population prevalence of SARS-CoV-2 antibodies in Santa Clara County implies that the infection is much more widespread than indicated by the number of confirmed cases. • Is Sweden's limited CV19 intervention going to prove others wrong or come back to haunt them? Sweden's government, unlike other European states, did not take dramatic lock-down actions. As of Thursday the 16<sup>th</sup>, their death toll is not significantly different from their neighbors', excluding Germany and Switzerland. This seems like a really important key metric to watch with respect to lessons learned.
